


International Bridges to Justice Monitoring & Evaluation Overview

We need to prove that what we are doing has a positive impact

- This is called 'Monitoring and Evaluation', or 'Impact Measurement'
- There is lots of jargon....however, it should be understood as a logical flow





Transforming the practice of justice worldwide

Simple Definitions

 Activities 	= The things that WE DO and HAVE CONTROL OVER
Inputs	= The staff time, money & other resources required to do the activities
Outputs	= The DIRECT RESULTS of what WE DO
Outcomes	= The CHANGES CAUSED by the things WE HAVE DONE
 Impact 	= The OVERALL EFFECT of the work WE & OTHERS DO
 Theory of Change 	= Logic for how what we do CAUSES the changes we seek to make

Note that we do <u>NOT</u> have to prove that what we do <u>directly causes</u> the ultimate impact we hope to have, because many other factors beyond our control will also have an effect.

However, we **DO** have to prove that what we do **CONTRIBUTES** in a positive way to the impact we hope to have.

For organizations to succeed, M&E work must inform strategic planning processes

- Organizations need to know this information so that they can:
 - Know (and prove) what they are doing makes a difference
 - Amend / adjust / tailor program work based on local needs
 - Prioritize scarce resources to have the biggest impact

Gathering & analyzing data must not be seen as a burden: If it is, it is not being done properly!



There are challenges in doing this in practice, but we have to make our best efforts

CHALLENGES

- Identifying valid performance indicators that are easily measureable
- Gathering the data
- Setting the baseline starting point, so we can show changes over time
- Gathering the data regularly, not just when we need to report it
- Impact may not be observable for some time
